LEST WE FORGET

The 1st of July marked the centenary of the Battle of the Somme in 1916. The British Army had over 57,000 casualties including over 19,000 killed. Amongst the dead was Private Frederick Charles Pugh born in Gloucestershire but moved to Orrell and attended our Parish School from 1892 to 1895 when he left age 13. He was killed on the 4th July 1916 age 34, he left a wife Margaret and 4 children. He has no known grave but is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial. Please remember him in your prayers.

Second Collection 10 July

The Sea Sunday collection will be taken on Sunday July 10th. The collection supports the work of the Apostleship of the Sea, which through the ecumenical partnership of the Liverpool Seafarers' Centre, offers pastoral care, practical help and hospitality to seafarers whilst they are in the Mersey Ports. 95% of all our goods,(fuel white goods, food etc), arrives by ship. We are highly dependent upon seafarers but they are largely invisible to us: they come from the developing countries and spend up to nine months at sea away from their families and friends."
