LEST WE FORGET

100 years ago the Battle of the Somme continued and another parishioner lost his life.

George Jackson was one of the 12 children of Thomas and Margaret (nee Swift), he lived on Alma Hill, was baptised in our Church and attended the Parish school. He was only 22 when he was killed near Albert on the 5th August 1916, his Obituary in the Wigan Observer records that he died of shrapnel wounds to the head. He has no known grave and is commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, please remember him in your prayers.
